



Proposed Street Scene

The image above shows part of the proposed street scene looking south (as represented by the red arrow on the Layout).

The dwellings have been designed such that they are contemporary versions of traditional houses. This will ensure that they sit comfortably within their surroundings and will contribute to the vibrant nature of the area.

The buildings will be finished in brickwork and render with tiled roofs and will include details such as a variety of roof forms, bays, balconies and feature windows.

The proposed dwellings have been designed to suit their location and care has been taken on all sides to provide interesting features and bays that will address corners and ends.

It is our view that the dwellings proposed will form an attractive addition to the street scene without competing with the existing housing. They will integrate in to the area whilst maintaining their own identity.

This information leaflet has been prepared by CMYK (Planning and Design) Limited. We are an architectural practice and are currently working on a residential scheme for submission to the Local Authority on land to the south of Milland Way.

We are seeking feedback on our proposals that can then be used in our planning process and would be grateful if you would take a few minutes to review this page and complete our questionnaire.

We are proposing a scheme of 26 new houses, the majority of which will be detached properties of 2 and 3 storeys in height. All properties will have on plot parking in line with Local Authority standards and all dwellings will have secure, private gardens.

As Outline consent already exists on this land, we are not seeking comments on the principles of development but would appreciate your feedback on the appearance of the dwellings.
